LENGTH OF MEMBERSHIP RECOGNITION

A LITANY OF PORT EDWARDS U.M.C. DISCIPLES (adapted from the 100th Anniversary book)

L.L.: This is not a narrative of buildings, events, or programs,

but our narrative of people!

One hundred and twenty-six years of faithful service in our community, has been made possible by people like you . . .

P: who have sewn costumes, choir robes, curtains, and tablecloths;

M: who have made phone calls, chauffeured, mailed cards, and written letters;

L.L.: who have helped in the office, in the nursery, and in the classroom;

P: who have cleaned the floors, the tables, and the pews;

M: who have donated cans of food, money to charities, and supplies to the church; L.L.: who have visited the sick in their homes, in the hospital, and in care facilities;

P: who have stood by those suffering, those grieving, and those dying;

M: who have served as teachers and sponsors, and counted the offering;

L.L.: who have served on teams and committees, chaired boards and councils;

P: who have served as lay leaders, worship leaders, choir members, musicians of every instrument;

M: who have provided their services as plumbers, electricians, mowers, rakers, trimmers, and painters;

L.L.: who have given their testimonies, shared their faith, and offered their giftedness;

P: who have challenged us to go deeper into community,

wider in our fellowship, broader in our learning,

stronger in our faith, farther in our missions, bigger in our love of Jesus, and louder in our justice, standing up for issues

and advocating for the rights and dignity of all God's people;

M: who have shown us the face and love of Christ, the grace and mercy of God, and the power and friendship of the Holy Spirit!

L.L.: To people like you, we are each indebted.

M: What they were, in years past, we are now.

ALL: What we are now, others will become.

Invitation to the Lord's Supper

† The Great Thanksgiving:

M: The Lord be with you.

P: And also with you.

M: Lift up your hearts.

P: We lift them up to the Lord.

M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

P: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

M: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always & everywhere to give thanks to You, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth.

[Pastor gives thanks by remembering the Story of God's good work with us in this world.]

M: And so, with Your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise Your name and join their unending hymn:

ALL: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of Your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

[Pastor continues giving thanks by recalling Salvation History. The Last Supper is recalled.]

M: And so, in remembrance of these Your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

ALL: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again!

[Pastor announces the present work of the Holy Spirit and celebrates the Holy Trinity.]

M: Through Your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in Your holy Church, all honor and glory are Yours, Almighty God, now and forever:

ALL: AMEN!

#2: For those who established this congregation and chartered this church in 1898, for their faith and vision, for their struggles and giftedness, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Generous God!

#3: For all who have been a part of this congregation and now have gone on to glory, for all who give freely of their time and resources,

for all whose wisdom guide our congregation through the tough times, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Gracious God!

#4: For those who have served so faithfully in leadership positions, for our clergy and staff throughout the decades,

for those who willingly give of their efforts to teach, encourage, counsel, and sponsor, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Plentiful God!

#5: For those who oversee our fellowship and refreshments, who enhance our congregational life, our care teams and prayer warriors, supporting one another and giving strength on the journey of life, as established in our baptismal covenant, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Benevolent God!

#6: For the baptisms we've celebrated, the confirmations and professions of faith we have witnessed, for each time a prayer has been answered, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Compassionate God!

#1: For wedded love consecrated here and beloved ones memorialized in this place, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Welcoming God!

#2: For a vibrant and "praise-full" congregation who honors You faithfully and steady through singing, listening, praying, and seeking, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Holy God!

#3: For commitments made, hearts touched, and lives turned around, for a place of refuge in times of storm, a beacon in times of darkness, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Loving God!

#4: For the hundreds of children and youth who have blessed this space as they grew to know and love Jesus and now serve Him in many places around the world, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Majestic God!

#5: For those called into ordained ministry from this congregation, like Pete Peterson, an ordained United Methodist minister, and Dennis Odekirk, an ordained Episcopalian rector, and all who have felt the call to ministry in their own setting, according to their own abilities, we say:

ALL: Thank You, Creator God!

#6: For all the times we have not lived up to our calling, nor lived into our mission; when we acted out of exclusion rather than inclusion, missed opportunities to share Your Good News, focused on programs instead of people,

turned a cold shoulder or a silent ear, we say:

ALL: Forgive us, Merciful God!

#1: For those way back then, whom no living memory can remember, some recorded in our rolls but many not;

for those we've known,

their faces we remember and their pew we still see,
